As we look toward another new year are we asking ourselves how we can become a more effective Church in walking closer to Jesus/loving Him, in being used by the Holy Spirit to promote the Gospel/love our neighbor, and in showing love to one another?

Most of you have belonged to the Lord for many years now and know from experience how your whole life is improved in its quality, depth, and benevolence as you draw closer to Jesus who walks with you through all of life, even the trials and temptations you face. You know how to draw closer to Him-it's a matter of taking the time, making it a priority, to do so. We have Bile study opportunities at Church and resources available for your use to help in that way also.

We always need to be looking for opportunities to increase our presence in our community, to find outreaches for the Gospel's saving message to reach into the hearts of others whether it's through the radio ministry, banners or signs on or by the Church building, gift baskets to new neighbors, or partnering with/coming along side of like-minded, Bible-believing ministries already in existence to support them in their efforts through prayer, financial contributions (even adding them to our missions support budget), or volunteering to be a part of the ministry work itself. Maybe creatively, within Biblical boundaries, looking for ways to share the love of Jesus with our neighbors. Besides learning about what to do and how to do so, we should be putting our feet, hands, and mouth to use in carrying those things out in a loving, Biblical context-which could mean telling the truth in love even to those who m

Lastly, there is the matter of showing love to one another at Church-PALC. How are you doing in that area? It has come to my attention recently that many of us aren't doing as well as we thought in this part of our ministry.

I am reading a book that is now unfortunately out of print, published by Augsburg in 1976 called Bright Valley of Love by Edna Hong. Briefly, it's a true story about an orphanage in Germany during WWII where many "outcast" children reside who have various handicaps but all are prone to some type of epileptic seizures. The Pastors and Sisters who take care of these special children give them joy and hope, even if they have multiple handicaps along with their seizures. These faithful servants, ministering in Jesus' Name, are able to understand that everyone, including themselves are "cracked", have faults and disabilities, some seen and some not visible to others, although the outworking of those hidden faults and disabilities can be seen or experienced by others. One young man can understand, in his interaction with the Pastor, that this man can look into his eyes and see his heart, looking beyond his deformed body to see his real self. I would say that's a good suggestion for all of us-that we look past the apparent faults of one another into the heart of each person that Jesus is shaping to look more and more like Himself. To recognize the value of each person to the Lord as fitting into a unique part of the Body of Christ, where the Lord has placed him or her to let their light shine for Him. To be an encouragement to one another with genuine appreciation and praise and when, on those small number of times where correction is needed, to be done in love and understanding in a private setting. We are, ALL OF US, always to display God's grace to one another as we have been shown much grace, understanding, and forgiveness by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Even overlooking faults to see the real person, to see their heart.
